



Just a reminder . . . please bring in your old palms to church and place them in the basket in the Narthex.



I invite you to take a copy of Lent 2022 "the Word among us" booklet. It contains the daily readings and meditations through Easter Sunday, April 17. The theme is "Remain in Me" with several articles about being chosen by Jesus to be with Him . . . Forever.

Lent is the 40-day, penitential season of preparation for the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday, (March 2) and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday with the beginning of the paschal Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday (April 14-16). All the faithful are



urged to develop and maintain a voluntary program of self-denial (in addition to the Lenten regulations that follow), serious prayer, and performing deeds of charity and mercy, including the giving of alms.

Lenten Regulations

- 1. **ABSTINENCE** Everyone <u>14</u> years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. **FAST** Everyone <u>18</u> years of age and under <u>59</u> is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.
- 3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful

Praying with Body, Mind, and Voice . . .

In the celebration of Mass, we raise our hearts and minds to God. During Mass, we assume different postures standing, kneeling, sitting, etc. These postures and gestures are not merely ceremonial. They have profound meaning and, when done with understanding, can enhance our participation in Mass.

Standing is a sign of respect and honor, so we stand as the celebrant who represents Christ enters and leaves the assembly. This posture has been understood as the stance of those who have risen with Christ and seek the things that are above. When we stand for prayer, we assume our full stature before God, in humble gratitude for the marvelous things God has done in creating and redeeming each one of us. By Baptism, we have been given a share in the life of God, and the posture of standing is an acknowledgment of this wonderful gift. We stand for the proclamation of the Gospel, which recounts the words and deeds of the Lord. The Bishops of the United States have chosen standing as the posture to be observed for the reception of Communion.

Preparing for Lent . . .

During Lent, Catholics do three things to grow closer to God: Pray, fast, and give alms. These are the three pillars of Lenten spirituality.

The first pillar is prayer. We pray to grow in our relationship with God and ask God for guidance on how to live according to His will.

The second pillar is fasting. Fasting means we give something up to be more sensitive and better understand and support those who are suffering from hunger.

The third pillar is almsgiving. When we give to those in need, we honor Jesus' call to care for our neighbors by serving and sharing with them.
