Message from Fr. Michal . . .

This week, we celebrate All Saints Day, All Souls Day, and a special Mass for our parishioners who passed away this past year. Please check the Mass schedule on page 2. *See you in church!!*



Our next servers meeting is Tuesday, Nov. 1, at 6:01pm in the church. I invite all current and new servers to be at this meeting to review your role as a server and discuss the upcoming special Masses.

From Nov. 1-8, you will have the opportunity to get plenary indulgences.

To receive a plenary indulgence, you need to first go to confession, then each day during this time period you are required to say prayers, receive communion, be free of venial sin, and make a visit to the cemetery from Nov. 1-8. I will be going after the morning Mass to the cemetery, so please join me. An indulgence is defined as "the remission before God of the temporal punishment due for sins already forgiven as far as their guilt is concerned." The first thing to note is that forgiveness of a sin is separate from punishment for the sin. Through sacramental confession we obtain forgiveness, but we aren't let off the hook as far as punishment goes. Indulgences are two kinds: partial and plenary. A partial indulgence removes part of the temporal punishment due for sins. A plenary indulgence removes all of it. A plenary indulgence is the remission, through the merits of Christ and the saints, through the Church, of all temporal punishment due to sin already forgiven. This punishment may come either in this life, in the form of various sufferings, or in the next life, in purgatory. What we don't get rid of here, we suffer there.

Join me at Adoration on Monday, Nov. 7, from 9:00am until 8:00pm. Please, sign up in the church narthex or at www.signupgenius.com/go/904054faea723a0f58-adoration5. Reconciliation is available from 7:00pm to 8:00pm. This is a wonderful opportunity to reflect on your faith life and pray.

At Sacred Heart Parish, we have two beautiful November traditions:

The Book of Remembrances and Jacob's Ladder

1. **Jacob's Ladder** is the colloquial name of a bridge between the earth and heaven that the biblical Patriarch Jacob dreamt about. Origin explains there are two ladders in the life of a Christian: the ladder we climb on earth to grow in virtue and the ladder we travel after death, climbing up to the heavens towards the light of God. So, if you have a picture of a **family member who died this year**, we encourage you to **place it on the ladder** where we all can keep the memory of your loved one alive in thought and prayer.

2. **The Book of Remembrances**, also known as the "Book of Life," gives us an opportunity to record the names of our deceased loved ones for the parish to remember in prayer during the month of November. It will be placed near the Jacob's ladder in the church. We invite you to take some prayer time, approach the book, and write the names of family and friends **who have died since November of 2021**. During November, at all the Masses, we will pray for those "whose names are recorded in our Book of Remembrances." For those we have loved in life will remain in our hearts forever.



Beginning in November, we are forming a Church Care Committee. This committee will meet monthly and write hand-written cards to members of our church. The cards will be written to those who are sick, depressed, forgotten, and lonely. Also, the cards will be sent to celebrate moments in life (such as new babies, achievements, and successes). The first meeting of the Care Committee is Monday, Nov. 7, at 9:15am, in the church narthex. If you have any questions, please contact Billi in the church office. Lastly, if you have any unused greeting cards to donate to this committee, please drop those off to the church office.

Answering your questions on dying and death . . .

The diocese has put together an easy to navigate and comprehensive look at end-of-life issues. Go to dio.org/funeral for questions like:

- ♦ Why should one pre-plan their funeral?
- ♦ If my loved one is dying, what should I do?
- ♦ Why must one insist on Catholic funeral rites?
- ♦ Why should one pray for the dead?
- ♦ Who should one insist upon being buried in a Catholic cemetery?

Also covered is the issue of cremation, among other topics.

As the month of November is dedicated to praying for the dead, now is a good time to learn more about dying and death from our Catholic faith perspective.

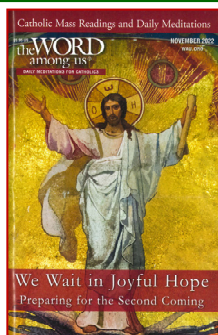

The trip included a presentation about the Evermode Institute and its rich history with the Hospital Sisters of St. Francis, who started our Effingham's St. Anthony Hospital, as well as other hospitals throughout Illinois and Wisconsin. This presentation included a video interview with one of the sisters who was present for the St. Anthony Hospital fire in 1949. It was very touching to hear her first-hand account of that tragedy. Following that presentation, we were able to tour the breathtaking St. Francis of Assisi Church on the Evermode property, while seeing and learning about some of its special and historical features. We ended our time there with a special Mass and lunch. We then drove across town to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception where we had a tour with Fr. Dominic Vahling who pointed out the history and stories behind the design and uniqueness of the Cathedral. We ended the day with a quick stop at Blessed Sacrament Parish to experience that beautiful church as well. Our sixth, seventh, and eighth graders joined together for an end-of-the-quarter celebration.

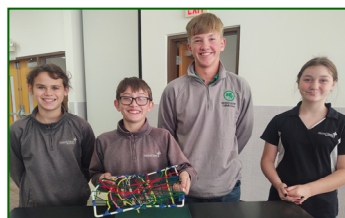

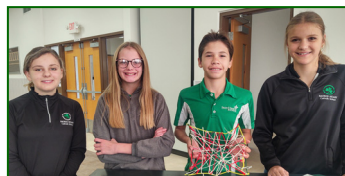

She stated that there are still 12 Sacred Heart School families waiting to see if additional funding becomes available for this year. As she stated, Catholic schools are a mission of the church, so any funding that can be obtained through Empower Illinois helps the school and the church.

Please consider donating to Empower Illinois to help provide families, who meet income requirements and complete an application process, with scholarships to attend Sacred Heart School. To encourage participation in this program, donors are eligible to receive a 75% state tax credit!!

When the Invest in Kids Act passed in 2017, it created the Tax Credit Scholarship (TCS) Program as a five-year pilot program. Despite many attempts to cut or eliminate the program, Empower Illinois was granted a one-year extension in 2021. However, it will end in 2023 if not extended again or made permanent.
