

This week, I invite everyone to join us at the liturgical celebrations for Holy Week. If you would still like to go to reconciliation, I will be available 30 minutes before the weekday Masses or by appointment.

On Holy Thursday, you are invited to adoration in the chapel which will begin immediately after Mass until 11:30pm. Enter in through the school.

Also, Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence, when only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals may be taken according to each person's needs. Eating between meals is not permitted.

Sacred Heart Church Restoration Update

The restoration of the church is in its second week, and the nave looks entirely different with the pews removed and three of the stained glass windows taken down. The pews were dismantled and transported to Wisconsin, where they are being stripped, repaired, sanded, and stained. Once completed, the company doing the refurbishing will place them in a climate-controlled warehouse until we are ready for their installation. The Jesus and the Word window, along with the Lord's Supper window, were removed by the company who had originally installed them. The windows were crated and are now being stored until they will be installed in our new Narthex. The stained glass window from the baptismal area will replace the large window in the priest sacristy.

Last week, we showed you photos of the dismantled sanctuary backdrop. Some of the wood that was removed from the backdrop will be used in the new backdrop, while the additional wood is being made into beautiful crosses and keepsakes, which will be sold at the upcoming Sacred Heart Parish Picnic. Special thanks to Joan Frey and her team of artists, for helping to repurpose this wood into amazing pieces of our parish history!






Help us earn free money for SHS . . .

Please join us with your personalized, unique baskets for a 20-minute blessing on Holy Saturday, April 20, at 10:30am, in the Parish Center! Fr. Michal hopes to share this tradition with the Sacred Heart Church & School families and guests.

A Cherished Catholic Easter Tradition

The blessing of the Easter Basket has been a cherished Catholic ritual for centuries among families of Eastern European origin and adopted by people of all ethnic backgrounds who enjoy this richly symbolic custom. On **Holy Saturday**, families would prepare their **Easter Baskets** to be blessed at church. After Easter Sunday's Resurrection Mass, the family and guests would share this blessed fare and exchange good wishes.

The Christian significance of Easter is symbolized in the foods used for the Holiday feast. Baskets are lined with a white cloth and **decorated with ribbons and greenery** to symbolize spring, renewal, and the Resurrection. Traditionally, the basket is covered with linen symbolizing the covering of Christ's shroud, and the basket would include:

- **Decorated hardboiled eggs** (representing Christ's Resurrection)
- **Lamb-shaped butter or sugar** (representing Christ as the "Lamb of God")
- **Bread** (symbolic of Jesus as the "Bread of Life")
- **Ham** (symbolic of great joy and abundance)
- **Sausage** (symbolic of God's favor and generosity)
- **Smoked bacon** (symbolic of the overabundance of God's mercy)
- **Salt** (symbolic of prosperity and justice and to remind us "You are the salt of the earth")
- **Cheese** (symbolizes the moderation that Christians should have at all times)
- **Horseradish & pepper** (symbolic of the Passion of Christ and the bitter herbs of the Passover).
- **A white candle** is often inserted into the basket to represent Christ as the "Light of the World."

This deeply-rooted tradition is as richly symbolic as it is heart-warming. Children are eager to help prepare and decorate the family basket and later, proudly carry it into church on Holy Saturday for the blessing. Some families with small children have their "little ones" carry their very own decorated basket filled with fruits, a chocolate bunny or some other treat to be blessed. The foods included within any basket can be easily personalized.
